INTRODUCING A SPORTY NEW TIMEPIECE THAT HAS A MINIMALIST, DRIVING-INSPIRED DESIGN

Nomos Glashütte has unveiled a brand new model called Autobahn, created in collaboration with Werner Aisslinger and Tina Bunyaprasit of renowned design studio Studio Aisslinger. As one might expect from its name, it features several automotive references.

The first of these is its lume, which runs from eight round to four o'clock, recalling a speedometer. The second is its date window, which shows three days at once, in reference to the odometers of vintage motor cars. Last are the curved surfaces of the dial and subdial, which evoke the banked corners of so many famous racetracks. Its dial has a simple design and clear typography, striking just the right balance between sporty and smart, and enabling a seamless day-to-night transition. Inside ticks Calibre DUW 6101, which is visible through the exhibition case back. It's available now at Watches of Switzerland and Goldsmiths in midnight blue (left) and sports grey and white (above right).

LONGINES REIMAGINES A CLASSIC MID-CENTURY DIVER'S WATCH

Swiss watch brand Longines has reimagined a 1960s model from its archives with the launch of the Legend Diver Watch with black PVD coating. Powered by an automatic mechanical movement, it blends bold 1960s design with modern watchmaking expertise. This 42mm stainless-steel piece has contemporary, performance-orientated features such as a sapphire crystal and a screw-down back to ensure water resistance to 300m – while retaining the boxed glass and bidirectional internal-turning bezel of the original. It comes on a Milanese-style rubber strap with a folding titanium clasp that has a black PVD treatment (£1,870).
