

## 1 Nomos Glashütte Tetra Hochmosik



In the beginning there were no tourbillons, retrograde indicators or three-dimensional moon phases. In the beginning there was an hour hand. We are getting back to basics and are allowing minute and seconds hands, as well.

**1** If you don't have an eye for detail you could easily conclude that Nomos Glashütte only makes one watch. Distinguishing an Orion from a Tangente is all in the details. The most distinctive model in the collection is, without a doubt, the square Tetra. The old Tetra was (too) small (29.5 x 29.5mm). The new Tetra measures 33 x 33mm and although that still sounds small, in reality it isn't. The proportions are perfect and the deep blue colour of the dial with its green details is outstandingly charismatic. The automatic calibre DUW-3001 used for the watch comes from the company's own manufacture.
